### **Merchant Navy Day**





### Named PCSO for Every Local Community

Every community in Sussex will have a named PCSO starting from November, Sussex Police has announced. The confirmation follows an investment in 100 extra PCSOs, secured through local funding by Police & Crime Commissioner Katy Bourne – bringing the total number to 296.

Chief Constable Giles York said the decision will put 'eyes and ears' into every part of the county and give local people a direct point of contact for local policing issues and concerns.

"When we introduced the new local policing model three years ago, we said it would be scalable. Now, thanks to this additional investment, we're in a position to strengthen local policing and we know this is what local communities want to see," said Mr York.

"Our PCSOs do an incredible job, every day, working alongside their police officer colleagues to prevent and detect crime and tackle anti-social behaviour in our local communities.

"This change means communities will soon begin to see and feel the benefits of their investment as new PCSOs are deployed over the coming months, where they will provide a visible policing presence and be a point of contact for local policing issues."

The change will take effect from November 4, when all existing PCSOs will adopt responsibility for a defined geographical area and be rolled out over the coming months as the additional PCSOs are recruited and deployed.

The 100 new posts will be allocated based on demand with details available locally and at <a href="https://www.sussex.police.uk">www.sussex.police.uk</a> from November 4th.

### Mental Health Matters



With one in four people in the UK suffering with a mental health issue in any given year, councillors at Lewes District Council have unanimously backed a motion that commits the authority to a range of far reaching measures designed to tackle the growing problem.

In addition to signing the Local Authority Mental Health Challenge, councillors have agreed to appoint an elected member of the council as a 'mental health champion'; to also appoint a current member of staff to act as a lead officer for mental health, to support positive mental health in the community, including local schools, and work with partners to offer effective support for people with mental health needs.

Councillor Sean MacLeod proposed the motion during a meeting of Full Council and said "It is heartening that the council already makes mental health awareness training available for staff. There is much more to do and with the steps that are included in this motion I believe we can make a very positive difference, not only within the authority, but in local communities too."

### Food Recycling

We are pleased to announce that we are working with Lewes District Council to help residents participate in the food waste recycling scheme by accessing FREE compostable liners - so please come to the Civic Centre to collect yours! Food waste is collected every week alongside your refuse collection. The food waste is turned into soil conditioner to be used by local farmers and gardeners - it might even be used to



grow more food! A third of the rubbish in an average household bin is food waste. Joining the food waste recycling scheme can reduce your impact on the environment and help you to save money on your food bill by cutting down on waste. The specialist composting process means you can even use the service to recycle things which can't be composted at home like cooked food, dairy, meat and fish including bones. ### Climate Change

Telscombe Town Council agreed a Climate Change Statement at the Full Council meeting on 18th September 2019, which undertakes to engage with the community to work towards carbon neutrality and environmental sustainability.

The emerging Peacehaven and Telscombe Neighbourhood Plan has a vision statement: "We seek to be sustainable with clean air and an environment which provides a good quality of life for all inhabitants"

Climate change is having a direct effect on Telscombe. In 2018, the Town Council was notified that due to cliff erosion on the sea edge of Telscombe Tye, the fence would need to be moved back at least six metres and that the adjoining land owned by Mitchell's and Butlers (Smugglers Rest) would also be affected. The costs will be around £21,000, and will be paid by Lewes District Council and the two land owners, with Council tax monies covering two thirds of costs.


