The Sussex Crisis Fund

The Sussex Crisis Fund has been set up by Sussex Community Foundation to support community and voluntary sector organisations in Sussex who are leading efforts to support people most affected by the Coronavirus outbreak. It is primarily designed to help fund the urgent needs facing communities as the virus affects them and to support for organisations with funding needs to enable them to adapt and respond to the crisis.

Emergency grants of up to £5,000 are offered to charities and community groups which are responding to the immediate crisis in the community and helping those most affected. The fund is also open for applications from Sussex Town and Parish Councils in places where the local voluntary organisations are not able, or need Parish Council support to do the work required.

The Sussex Crisis Fund supports community and voluntary sector organisations who are leading efforts to support people most affected by the coronavirus outbreak. It is primarily designed to help fund the urgent needs facing our communities as the virus affects them and to support for organisations with funding needs to enable them to adapt and respond to the crisis. Emergency grants of up to £5,000 are offered to charities and community groups which are responding to the immediate crisis in the community and helping those most affected. They are gathering information about priority needs and will use this to strengthen and develop the criteria.

Timescales: They will be responding to grant requests as soon as they can, aiming for decisions on emergency requests within 2–3 weeks.

What can I apply for? Funding is offered to organisations delivering activities and services to support people who are directly suffering as a result of the Coronavirus outbreak.

Examples of the kinds of things that might be funded:-

- Organisational running costs including volunteer expenses, staff costs, and transport
- Small capital costs to support operational activity relating to the crisis
- Specific costs that enable the charity to adapt to enable them to respond to the crisis (e.g. computer equipment to enable staff or volunteers to work remotely). - Supporting the ongoing needs of vulnerable people to ensure that their health and wellbeing is maintained.
- Activities that relieve pressure on local statutory services, particularly emergency or health and social care provision, or complement their response.
- Groups and activities that support vulnerable people self-isolating (older people, people with pre-existing medical conditions etc.)
- Foodbanks and organisations working to combat hardship caused by the pandemic including child hunger.
- Community response co-ordination.

- Organisations that have been specifically established to respond to the crisis.
- Volunteer costs for new and existing organisations responding to the affect of the crisis.
- Additional costs of working remotely and adapting services delivered in the wider community.
- Emotional support, mental health and bereavement support.

At a later point, should funds allow, the fund may provide:

- Larger grants of up to £10,000 to organisations meeting the above criteria and/or
- Support for organisations that provide support for vulnerable groups to counter the loss of income and fundraising which can be directly linked to the pandemic.

COVID-19 Mutual Aid Group

There is a local volunteering hub in place and operating. The Peacehaven Covid-19 Mutual Aid Group have already linked up with Lewes District Council, East Sussex County Council, other Sussex Mutual Aid groups plus 3VA and the strategic planning team. Below is a list of shops with their special opening times and more information on what each store says they're doing, plus further links:-

- **Asda** – see below for new volunteer shopping card
- **Aldi** – shops open 30 minutes early, Monday to Saturday
- **Iceland** – the first hour of opening, every day
- **Lidl** – check local stores
- **M&S** – Monday and Thursday, the first hour of opening
- **Morrisons** – See below for their new food boxes
- **Sainsbury's** – Monday, Wednesday and Friday, 8am-9am
- **Tesco** – Monday, Wednesday and Friday, 9am-10am (not Express stores)
- **Waitrose** – first hour of opening, every day

Asda say: We're offering a new '[volunteer shopping card](#)' (bought online) so a friend or relative can more easily shop on your behalf. Should any of our customers be self-isolating, we would ask that they advise us of this in the 'Other Information' section when placing their order and tell us where they would like us to leave their order (e.g. on the doorstep, at the front gate etc.).

Iceland say: We're temporarily limiting online orders to customers who are over state pension age, self-isolating and other vulnerable people, such as the disabled. If you aren't over state pension age and can get to one of our stores, we kindly ask that you use our [Store Locator](#) to find your local Iceland and complete your shop there. We are encouraging all stores to dedicate opening hours to the elderly and vulnerable on all days. Check details with local stores.

Sainsbury's say: Every Monday, Wednesday and Friday all our supermarkets will dedicate [8am – 9am](#) to serving elderly, disabled and vulnerable customers. We are giving our customers who are vulnerable priority access to our online home delivery service. The government is identifying customers who they consider the most vulnerable, and we're now in process of emailing these customers to offer them priority access. We'll continue to do this as the government identifies more vulnerable people. We're also increasing access to our Click & Collect service. For volunteers, family and friends doing shopping for others who are isolated, managing payment or exchanging cash can be a blocker. This week Sainsbury's has launched **Volunteer Shopping Cards**. They're available for customers to buy online at www.sainsburysgiftcard.co.uk. They range from £5 to £250 and can be bought by a customer and then directed to the volunteer to use in store.

Tesco say: We want to help everyone through these uncertain times, especially those who need extra help. So all our stores (except Express stores) will be prioritising the elderly and most vulnerable for one hour between 9am and 10am every Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

Waitrose say: Waitrose stores will dedicate the first hour of opening as a priority shopping time for the elderly, the vulnerable and those who look after them. We've committed at least 25% of our orders to elderly and vulnerable customers, who we're in the process of contacting to offer slots. We're increasing slots significantly and by next week this will reach 20% extra compared

to usual. Waitrose & Partners is supporting the Lewes branch with a same day telephone delivery service for vulnerable customers who are unable to come in and shop.

We would define vulnerable as including the elderly, those in self-isolation, less abled, new and expectant mothers or anyone with an underlying health condition who cannot go out to the shops themselves. This is a trial covering the whole of the Lewes District area, supported by spare resources from John Lewis & Partners, and only being conducted in a limited number of branches across the country.

The broad overview of the process will be;

1. Customer phones the branch expressing interest in purchasing one of our set Essential Packages. This is a pre-set list of items to cover store cupboard and fruit and vegetables within **four key options (an Essential Food package, Essential Vegan Package, Essential Gluten Free Package, and an Essential Non Food Package)**
2. The branch will take the customers details, assemble the order, phone the customer back and take payment securely over the phone
3. The branch, supported by John Lewis, will arrange with the customer to **deliver the package to their home address within 24 hours, or for the customer or their carer to come to the branch and collect the package 'contact free'**
