




Celebrate Official Opening of Coastal Footpath

Following a lengthy community campaign by Telscombe Town Council, The Ramblers Association the South Downs Society and local residents' associations, footpath 12a which spans the Southern



Water site on the south side of the A259 will be officially opened by the Mayor of Telscombe Cllr J Wilkins on the 30th November 2017. Footpath 12a which is part of the Greenwich Meridian Trail and will form part of the National Coastal Path, was closed in the early 1970's by Southern Water works at the Portobello site. The footpath remained closed and unmentioned until the early part of the century when an eagled eyed member of the South Downs Society noticed that the footpath still legally existed. A campaign soon followed to open the footpath to the public and after a further fifteen years, Southern Water have finally provided access to the route. Special thanks go to Peter Seed of the Ramblers Association, Dave Brookshaw of the South Downs Society and Cllr Dave Neave Chair of Telscombe Planning & Highways Committee for their continued efforts with the campaign which has helped achieve an open pathway from Brighton to Peacehaven.

East Sussex Libraries Consultation by East Sussex County Council

In this libraries consultation we are asking for your views on our draft Strategy for East Sussex libraries over the next five years.

The draft Strategy sets out our proposed approach to provide a modern, sustainable Library and Information Service for the future, recognising the financial constraints which East Sussex County Council faces and also the changes in the way that people are using libraries.

Our draft Strategy presents proposals for a needs-based library service. This means a library service where we prioritise our resources to achieve outcomes that will best meet the needs of those who live, work and study in East Sussex.

Our work to produce our draft Strategy shows that there are significant needs across the county, and especially within certain communities, around literacy, attainment, employment and ultimately health and wellbeing, which the Library and Information Service is ideally placed to help tackle.

You can read our draft Strategy and all of the evidence on which our proposals are based in full on our website at eastsussex.gov.uk/librarystrategy. Alternatively, you can request a paper copy by contacting us using the details below.

The consultation runs for 12 weeks, from 21 September to 14 December 2017. We would like to hear from you whether or not you currently use the Library and Information Service. We will do all we can to make it as easy as possible for everyone to have their say.

Lewes District Council has taken action to streamline the process for recycling at home. Instead of sorting recycling into an assortment of boxes and bags, residents will soon have one wheelie bin for all their paper, cans, plastics, cardboard and glass.

Councillor Paul Franklin, Cabinet Portfolio Holder for Waste and Recycling said: "When my colleagues and I speak to local people about household recycling many bemoan the overly complicated approach we have

in Lewes to sorting items. With the introduction of one wheelie bin we are sweeping away this extra layer of household admin so people can get on with what's most important in their daily lives."

The Council will take away the old boxes and bags when they deliver the new wheelie bin to each property. Councillor Franklin added: "Delivering up to 35,000 wheelie bins can't be done overnight so we are introducing the new service in stages, starting in East Saltdean, Telscombe and Peacehaven from November. The service will then be introduced across the district in stages between January and July 2018."

Nothing will change until the new bins are delivered to homes over the coming months, so residents should continue to recycle as they do now. And when the new wheelie bin arrives weekly refuse and fortnightly recycling days will remain the same. The council teams will also continue to collect food waste and garden waste as they currently do.

Councillor Andy Smith, Leader of Lewes District Council, said: "We wanted a simpler way of recycling that will be easier for people and mean more is recycled and I believe we now have a system that will achieve those goals. There is lots on the council website and we'll be putting information leaflets through doors in advance of delivering the new bins."

Horse Riders and Sensible Road Safety

We are very lucky in Telscombe Village, Telscombe Cliffs and East Saltdean, in that we are never very far away from the South Downs National Park, which is there for all of us to use and enjoy, including horse riders. However, recently some horse riders have been given a 'rough ride' by certain motorists who think it is okay to:


Speed past horse riders at close quarters

Speed round blind bends

Verbally abuse horse riders

Ignore the fact that horse riders are also road users, just like them, and have rights too.

Can <u>every</u> road user, pedestrians/equestrians/cyclists/car and motorcycle drivers, please note the following:



Highway Code Rule 215 – "Be particularly careful of horse riders and horse-drawn vehicles <u>especially</u> when overtaking. Always pass <u>wide</u> and <u>slowly</u>. Horse riders are often children, so take extra care and remember riders may ride in double file when escorting a young or inexperienced horse or rider. Look out for horse riders' and horse drivers' signals and heed a request to slow down or stop. Take great care and treat all horses as a potential hazard; they can be unpredictable, despite the efforts of their rider/driver."

Remember that horses can be easily "spooked", they are not often frightened by traffic, but can react to, for instance, a cat scrambling a wall, or a child jumping up and down on a trampoline. If they do get spooked, they often react by going the opposite direction into the middle of the road and believe it or not, the motor vehicle is likely to come off the worse!

Finally, remember that everyone deserves to be treated with respect – what's so terrible in being held up for a couple of minutes in order that you pass safely, without the need for rude gesturing or swearing at the rider? Does that really achieve anything?

Keep Warm and Well in East Sussex

Living in a cold home can harm your health. It can make a range of health conditions worse, such as breathing and heart problems, and asthma in children. It can also impact on your mental wellbeing.

You don't have to sit at home wrapped in blankets to keep the cold away – follow our thrifty winter tips to keep your house warm this winter. Find out if you can get a free Winter Home Check. This visit can help with the little things like changing your gas or electricity supplier so that your bills are lower, small repairs to heating or loans of heating equipment, and installing draft excluders and for some people it can help get access to with more expensive items such as free or reduced cost replacement boilers or heating systems. If you know of a family with young children, an older person or someone with heath difficulties who feels cold at home and is on a low income, then let them know about this free service.

From handy tips and DIY hints to details about grants and winter payments, the following site will provide you with information and support to help you keep warm and well this winter for less:-

How to apply for a free Winter Home Check

This service is funded by East Sussex County Council and provided by Osborne Energy. Phone free on 0800 085 1674 to arrange a visit, or fill out the online application form.

Who can apply

If you're on a low income and have a long term health condition or disability, or are on certain benefits, you can apply for a Winter Home Check. You'll also need to own your own home or rent it privately.

Full details about who can apply are provided below, but if you're not sure whether you could have a Winter Home Check please call us to talk it through or to find out about other help that might be available.

If you're renting your home then the owner's permission may be needed in situations where you qualify for certain improvement works. The Winter Home Check service will offer to talk to your landlord to make these arrangements.

If you're a social housing tenant (in a council or housing association home) and you need advice or support about keeping warm at home then please contact your landlord.
